Our junior high students traveled to **Edmonton** to visit the **Legislative Assembly and Activate** on November 7. Activate is a physically interactive arcade where students compete or work together in groups of five. It was a great team building activity and was awesome fun. At the legislative assembly we were given a tour of the building and its history and were able to be introduced to the chamber and had the chance to watch the question period. It was very interesting.

On November 14, Clearview Public **School Trustees and superintendent** will tour our school and spend time in many of our classrooms. It is great to see our trustees interact with the staff and students of our community. Having a connection to our school community may help them understand the dynamics of our school and guide decisions that they make that may affect us Also on November 14th, our **Junior High options** change from art and outdoor ed. to Career and Technology Foundations or Makerspace. From the 15th until January 30 grade 7 - 9 students will choose projects that are of high interest for them. The French option will continue on Tuesdays for those students that had signed up for French in the fall.

Report cards will be sent home in paper form on November 15 for both elementary and junior high students. Junior high report cards for grades 7 to 9 have been created by teachers using a program called Powerschool. Along with the paper copy of the report cards, parents can access the Parent Portal to view student mark summaries. Parents and students will have access to this portal throughout the year as assignments and grades are updated. A print out of your login information will be sent home with your child's report card. Please note that the attendance recorded on the report card represents absences in the morning and afternoon - 2 absences recorded for 1 full day away from school.

Parent teacher interviews will be held on November 21. Mrs. Lepard shared a link through BrightArrow this week to book your face to face interview with your child's teacher(s). Students in kindergarten to grade 2 will have fifteen minute time slots. Students in grades 3 - 9 will have ten minute time slots. Please keep to these times as teachers will have many parents to meet with in a short time.

We are anticipating two showings of our **Christmas Concert** this year on December 19th, one in the afternoon and one in the evening. Each family will receive four tickets for the afternoon show and four for the evening show and will be asked to trade with other families using the EEPS Facebook page or by calling the school office. Our grade six class will be showcased again as the actors and actresses of the production called "Christmas at the O.K. Corral". EEPS School council will be asking parents to donate **bake sale items and/or gift bags** for the raffle table. We will also have a bottle drive the day of the concert as a fundraiser for the junior high Quebec/ Montreal and Ottawa trip. Please save and bring in your bottles!

Severe Weather ...

TO: Parents and Legal Guardians



With our winter conditions in Alberta and our area, we would like to remind parents and legal guardians on the guidelines for school busing during severe weather conditions (including temperature guidelines). Clearview's <u>Administrative Procedure 503 "Severe Weather Conditions"</u> outlines transportation operations during those weather conditions that may impact the safety of students and staff.

Highlights of Clearview's guidelines you may wish to be aware of include:

- School bus operations will be suspended when visibility is 0.2 km (200 metres) or less (for example, during snow or fog conditions)
- School bus operations will be suspended when the air temperature is colder than -35 degrees celsius' or when the temperature taking into consideration wind speed exceeds -40 degrees celsius.
- When a decision is made to operate the buses, the decision to send children on the bus is that of the
 parents/guardians. The parents/guardians should consider factors such as age and health of children,
 as well as any other factors they deem advisable.
- All students are required to be prepared for severe weather conditions, and carry with them appropriate winter footwear, outerwear, including headgear, and gloves or mitts.
- When most or all school bus services are suspended for an area or school, all schools shall normally remain open to students, which may be determined otherwise by the Superintendent or designate.

- 1. What was your favorite thing you did at school?
- 2. What was your least favorite thing you did at school?
- 3. What was the hardest thing you did today?
- 4. What made you happy today?
- 5. What did you do at recess?
- 6. Who did you eat lunch with?
- 7. What did you/your friend eat for lunch?
- 8. What are some of your class rules?
- 9. What book did your teacher read to the class? What was it about?
- 10. What are you excited to do at school tomorrow?
