In February, our **junior high options** will transition yet again. Grade seven through nine students will be traveling to Stettler for the CTS options; home economics and industrial arts. Please discuss your child's choice with them as they will be deciding their option class as early as next week. Students will travel to Wm E Hay on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons and occasional Fridays. Please consult our school website for a calendar.



Our Canyon ski, snowboard and tubing trip is scheduled for February 6. Traditionally, almost all students take part in the day. A staff member will stay back at the school to be with the handful of students that may not attend. Please understand that all students that remain at the school will be supervised in one group. There will not be regular classes. Please make sure all forms related to skiing have been returned. We are in the process of organizing a grade 6 through 9 ski trip to Nakiska for March 20. Our students will combine with students from Big Valley, Byemoor and Donalda to help keep our costs low. A note was sent home earlier in the week outlining costs and expectations.

The Erskine Curling Club has invited our students to watch the **2025 Alberta Boston Pizza Cup Men's Curling Playdowns.** On Wednesday, February 5 at 1:00, our grade 1, 7 and 8 students will travel to the Stettler Recreation Centre to watch. On Thursday, February 6, prior to heading to Canyon Ski Hill for tubing, our Kindergarten students will travel to Stettler to watch. On Friday, February 7 at 8:30, our grade 2, 5 and 9 classes will travel to Stettler to watch and finally, at 1:00, later that day, our grade 3, 4 and 6 students will get their chance to attend as well. Special thanks to members of the Erskine Curling Club for giving our students such a wonderful opportunity!

In keeping with our HourZero safety protocols, we will continue to practice **Lockdown** drills in the months of January and February. Just like a fire drill, we try our best to prepare students for this possibility without creating fear or anxiety.

Classes will soon be starting to take advantage of the Erskine outdoor skating rink for **skating**. Please look for a message from your child's teacher indicating when they plan to be using the rink and please make arrangements for helmets, skates and mitts for those days. Our insurance company has made it difficult for schools to introduce hockey on our local rinks by requiring face masks on helmets, neck guards and elbow pads. Teachers of our older students may allow hockey for students that bring these items, however, teachers of our younger students may choose to encourage skating only. Thank you so much to the many volunteers in our community that have worked to prepare the ice and maintain it for the season and those that are able to come in and tie skates and buckle helmets.

Alberta Education's Accountability Survey will be coming out in January. Students in grade 4 - 9, staff and parents will be asked to complete the survey online. Thank you in advance for your support in completing these surveys as they help guide the programming that we offer in our school. Please see the attached letter from Alberta Education.

With the **colder weather** upon us, please send toque, mitts and scarves with your children as they are expected to go outside for recess. Our guideline for inside recesses for kindergarten to grade 6 is a temperature or wind chill of around -25. Throughout the winter, grade 7 - 9 students have the option of remaining inside in the gym.

Just a reminder that from time to time students need to **leave our school campus** because they are not feeling well during the school day or they have an appointment. Sometimes older students reach out to their parents through a cell phone text or call. **Parents please be sure and check in** at the office prior to leaving or call and let us know what is happening.

Severe Weather ...



TO: Parents and Legal Guardians

With our winter conditions in Alberta and our area, we would like to remind parents and legal guardians on the guidelines for school busing during severe weather conditions (including temperature guidelines). Clearview's Administrative Procedure 132 "Severe Weather Conditions" outlines transportation operations during those weather conditions that may impact the safety of students and staff.

Highlights of Clearview's guidelines you may wish to be aware of include:

- School bus operations will be suspended when visibility is 0.2 km (200 metres) or less (for example, during snow or fog conditions)
- School bus operations will be suspended when the air temperature is colder than -35 degrees celsius' or when the temperature taking into consideration wind speed exceeds -40 degrees celsius.
- When a decision is made to operate the buses, the decision to send children on the bus is that of the parents/guardians. The parents/guardians should consider factors such as age and health of children, as well as any other factors they deem advisable.
- All students are required to be prepared for severe weather conditions, and carry with them appropriate winter footwear, outerwear, including headgear, and gloves or mitts.
- When most or all school bus services are suspended for an area or school, all schools shall normally remain open to students, which may be determined otherwise by the Superintendent or designate.

Please be aware that in the event the school bus services is cancelled or late on a particular day, updates are available using Bright Arrow or the website at www.clearview.ab.ca.
